These events are educational information-exchange workshop programs about protecting Central Valley drinking water and finding solutions for groundwater contamination, whether naturally occurring or manmade. The target audience for the program includes managers and operators of water supply and treatment systems, local leaders in business and agriculture, civic and community organizations, and decision-makers with responsibility for citizen health and welfare.

The American Ground Water Trust has completed over a dozen information exchange workshops throughout the US (CA, AZ, NV, NE, MI, OH, PA, NJ, NH) about groundwater quality challenges; including focus on nitrate, Chrome 6, perchlorate, TCP, and the PFAS suite of compounds.

What the Fresno and Bakersfield workshops will discuss:

- Overall condition of drinking water quality in Central Valley communities
- Health and economic impacts of inadequate drinking water
- SGMA requirements related to the availability of safe drinking water
- Jurisdictional authority/responsibility for ensuring the availability of safe drinking water
- The natural or anthropogenic origins of chemicals and compounds of concern
- How correct well drilling, construction and monitoring can have a positive impact on water quality
- Water quality testing capabilities and the interpretation of test results
- Water quality treatment technologies, how they work and what they cost
- Legal remedies for recovering treatment costs by communities, utilities and water agencies
- How to find funding for capital investment in water infrastructure improvements
- Case studies of contamination reduction/ removal

BACKGROUND:

The motivation for this workshop is the AGWT's education mission to provide objective information to facilitate groundwater management decisions. Water providers are faced with an urgent need to respond to concerns about health issues, property values, remediation options and infrastructure costs related to the occurrence of contamination in drinking water sources.

The workshop will provide transparency in information with free exchange of legal, hydrological, regulatory and technical opinions. There are major challenges faced by individuals and communities, local and state agencies and potential responsible parties. Principal workshop objectives are to assess the magnitude of the problem, the technology available to treat affected wells, the need for additional regulations and to determine effective ways to cover remediation and compensation costs for those affected by poor quality drinking water.

PARTICIPATION:

The program is of particular relevance to water utility managers and their board members in areas affected (or potentially affected) by contamination. It is anticipated that workshop attendance will also include, environmental organizations, property transaction specialists, health officials, groundwater industry professionals, water engineers and entities with regulatory authority at city, county, state, and federal level.

FORMAT:

The workshop will be strictly conducted in a non-confrontational and non-commercial information-exchange format. Presenters include scientists, water providers, water regulators, attorneys, and equipment manufacturers. Following each presentation there will be time for Q&A among all participants. All presenters have been asked to provide information, advice, guidance and insight in an inclusive, generic and non-commercial information-exchange format.
