

Regional Recycled Water Advanced Purification Center Tour Details

This new demonstration facility, a partnership between The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California and the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County, will purify treated wastewater to potentially replenish groundwater basins in Los Angeles and Orange Counties used as a drinking water supply. It could lead to a full-scale program purifying 150 million gallons of water per day, becoming one of the largest water reuse projects of its kind in the world.

The tour will begin February 13th at 9:30am at the Joint Water Pollution Control Plant Administrative Office, located at 24501 S. Figueroa Street, Carson, CA 90745. The tour will end at 11:30am.

Parking is readily available.
